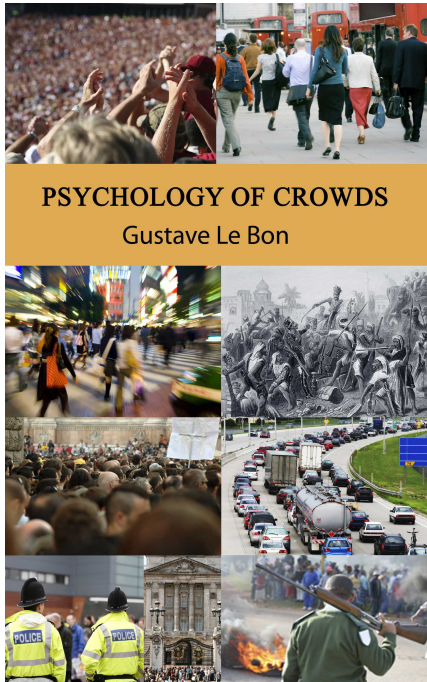


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Sparkling Books has corrected errors and anomalies in the original translation by reference to the Alcan edition. We have maintained the original footnotes and have added some footnotes of our own.
