Continued free movement	Both variations of Soft Brexit, and the Close Association agreement
Remaining in the single market	Both variations of Soft Brexit, and the Close Association agreement
Continuing with EU support to Scottish farming and universities	None, because any form of Brexit will lose EU support. Scotland may demand later that England reimburse its losses
Keeping social protection of workers' rights and human rights	None, although workers' rights could be negotiated in a Close Association agreement, or transferred to UK law. The UK government has undertaken to transfer workers' rights to UK law. Human rights are governed by a separate European convention
A common approach to the common good, for example tackling terrorism and climate change	Close Association agreement
Being able to influence single market rules	Close Association agreement
